

EpiPen Care and Use

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Anaphylaxis is a serious and potentially life-threatening allergic reaction that requires immediate medical attention, making EpiPens an essential tool for individuals with known severe allergies.

An EpiPen contains epinephrine, a medication that can help decrease a body's allergic reaction by:

- Relaxing the muscles in the airway to make breathing easier.
- Helping to reverse the rapid and dangerous decrease in blood pressure.
- Relaxing the muscles in the stomach, intestines, and bladder.

Epinephrine Potential Side Effects

Like all medicines, EpiPen may cause side effects. Side effects may include paleness, dizziness, weakness, shaking, headache, throbbing, restlessness, anxiety, tenseness, and fear.

Using an EpiPen Auto Injector

Inject EpiPen at the first sign or symptom of a severe allergic response to a known or suspected allergen. Severe allergic reactions are not always predictable. Obvious warning signs are not always present before serious reactions occur, follow medical advice.

- Grasp EpiPen with orange 1. tip pointing downward (Orange to the Thigh, Blue to the Sky).
- 2. Remove blue safety cap by pulling straight up do not bend or twist



- Place the orange tip 3. against the middle of the outer thigh
- Swing and push the auto-injector firmly into the thigh until it 4. "clicks"
- 5. Hold firmly in place for three seconds – count slowly, "1, 2, 3"
- Call 911 (if not already done). The effects of epinephrine can 6.

wear off, or a second reaction may occur. Using an EpiPen does not replace seeing a doctor or going to the hospital.

- 7. Give any used EpiPen Auto-Injectors to emergency responders or emergency room personnel to discard.
- *** Instructions are on the barrel of the EpiPen Auto-Injector.

Disposal

EpiPen Auto-Injectors must be disposed properly to prevent injury to others.

- If used, give the EpiPen to emergency responders or emergency room personnel to discard.
- If expired, contact your local pharmacy to assist in disposing the EpiPen according to regulations.
